

Julianna Brush. a scientist at NOAA's Cooperative Oxford Laboratory in Oxford, Marvland, will be speaking about her work assessing the health of aquatic animals in the Chesapeake Bay and how this relates to how people use the land (developed/residential, farming, or mixed). She will share how she decided to go into science, what she does, and why it's important for the future of the Chesapeake Bay and beyond.


